I hope you have all enjoyed the carefree days of summer, and taken the time for some valuable, quality family time. It is hard to believe, but it is nearly time for the start of another school year.



## Arrival and Dismissal

School opens on Tuesday, September 8<sup>th</sup> with full-day sessions for Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Students should be in their classrooms by 8:00 a.m.; dismissal is at 2:20 p.m. for bus students; 2:40 p.m. for walkers and parent pick-up. All students, including Kindergarten, should report directly to their classrooms. **Grades K and 2-8 will be in the main building, while 1<sup>st</sup> Grade, Pre-K and Wrap-Around-Care will be housed in the Annex Building. Please note: Miss Zambito's 1<sup>st</sup> grade is located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the annex.** Beginning at 2:20 p.m. our bus students will be dismissed as their appropriate bus arrives. At approximately 2:35 p.m. after the bus traffic has ended, teachers will escort those students who are walking or being transported by private vehicles to the parking lot. Vehicles may be waiting in the Church parking lot. No vehicles will be allowed near the school building past the barriers. They should not enter or exit Summit St. as the students are crossing the parking lot. Please be patient at dismissal and do not attempt to move your vehicle while children are still walking out to their cars. Please help to keep our children safe! **We ask that walkers and riders not request earlier dismissals due to safety concerns with the bus traffic.**

## Tuition Statements

Tuition Statements for the 2015-2016 school year were sent to each family in July. If you have not returned your signed statement, please do so as soon as possible. Thank you for your cooperation!

REMINDER: All families must register on our website on FACTS tuition management to begin payments in August or September or payment in full was expected by August 1<sup>st</sup>.

## Parent/Student Handbook

The **revised** Handbook and School Calendar will be handed out to all families during the first few days of school. Thank you to our Home School Association--SOS (Supporters of St. Joseph School) for providing the funds for printing these handbooks. Parents should read the handbook with your child(ren) and discuss school policies. **All parents and students must sign and return the agreement found at the end of the handbook.** Students in grades 3-8 will receive a school assignment book. It is **mandatory** that they have this throughout the school year. Please assist us in teaching our students that personal organization is a life skill. If your child loses this, we have limited replacements available for \$7.00.

## Parent Volunteers

As always, we depend considerably upon the generosity and good will of you, our families, for assistance with so many school functions. Volunteers are needed in the following areas:

- To assist in our cafeteria during lunch periods

The Material Fee helps us meet the cost of copy paper, construction paper, art supplies, report cards, assignment books, etc. This fee has been included in all FACTS tuition management accounts.

## Lunches

Hot lunches will be available starting on Tuesday, Sept. 8<sup>th</sup>. The lunch menus as well as the meals are prepared by Notre Dame High School. Cost of the hot lunch for grades K-8 is \$2.30 which includes milk or juice. Extras are available for \$1.00. Milk at **\$0.50** will be available for students who wish to pack a lunch.

**Families under the free and reduced plan last year will still be eligible for the month of September until the new applications are filed.**

New applications will be sent home the first week of school.

Hot dogs, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, deli sandwiches, yogurt fun packs, chicken finger wraps and salads are also available each day.

**All Kindergarten Students will receive a "free lunch" on the first day of school!!!**

The Healthy Hunger-Free Act requires that school lunches offer a balanced meal of nutrient-rich foods-emphasizing lean-protein, fruits, veggies, and whole grains. Also, under the new regulations, we still will be offering snacks but the selection will fall under the nutrient guidelines. Some people who purchase Scripts weekly have already earned several hundred dollars in tuition credit. We currently keep a number of cards such as Tops, WalMart, Wendy's, Arby's, Target and JCPenney in stock. A large variety of others can be ordered on Mondays by noon, for pick-up on Friday. ## After School Program



## 10 Ways to Help Your Child Do Well in School

1. **Show you care.** Your child needs hugs and words of support. Ask your child about school each day.
2. **Read, read, read.** Read with your child or have him or her read every day. Make it fun- talk about what you've read.
3. **Make home a place for learning.** Help your child practice reading, writing, math, and science skills. Stimulate your child's creativity.
4. **Promote healthy habits.** Make sure your child gets plenty of sleep and exercise and eats balanced meals. Schedule regular check-ups.
5. **Be a role model.** Your child learns from you. Be positive about education and show you enjoy learning.
6. **Encourage independence.** Allow your child to make mistakes and learn to accept their consequences. Give your child responsibilities, such as household chores.
7. **Create a study routine.** Set a time and quiet place for your child to work every day. Go over homework together.
8. **Get involved.** Meet with your child's teacher, attend school events and help out at school if you can.
9. **Build success.** Help raise your child's self-esteem by setting reachable goals and praising your child's efforts, not just results.
10. **Make school important.** Insist on good attendance and punctuality.

## VIRTUS Training



## Dress Code

Personal appearance is taken very seriously at St. Joseph School. We require a uniform dress code for both boys and girls. It helps in fostering a Christian educational environment. In addition to the uniform dress code, all students' hair must be clean and well-groomed with no wild styles (including colored or dyed hair) or shaved heads. Boy's hair must not be below their eyebrows or shirt collars. Pierced earrings are not acceptable for boys; hats or caps are not allowed in the building. No excessive jewelry or dangling earrings are allowed for girls. One post style earring per ear lobe only. Make-up is not acceptable for girls. Uniforms for Grades K-8 are to be worn starting the first day of school. The Principal reserves the right to decide if a student is dressed in compliance with the dress code.

### BOYS:

- Navy blue uniform dress pants
- White long or short sleeved oxford cloth shirt
- Monogrammed navy or green V-neck or cardigan sweater (optional)
- Sneakers or shoes
- Black or white ankle socks without logos. Knee socks are not allowed.
- Blue ties for grades K-5 (can be purchased from the main office for \$8.00) Any style tie may be worn in grades 6-8

### GIRLS:

- Plaid uniform jumper in Grades K-5 (must touch knees)
- Plaid or navy blue uniform skirt in Grades 6-8 (must touch knees)
- White long or short sleeved oxford shirt or blouse
- Monogrammed navy or green V-neck or cardigan sweater (optional)
- White turtlenecks
- Navy blue dress pants may be worn from Nov. 1st- March 31st.
- Navy, green, or white tights, knee socks, or ankle socks
- Sneakers or shoes- no cloas or crocs

### BOYS AND GIRLS:

- White polo monogrammed shirts may be worn during the months of September, October, April, May, and June
- White long-sleeved banded bottom monogrammed shirts may be worn in grades K-5 throughout the school year. **\*\*THESE SHIRTS MUST BE BANDED ON THE BOTTOM and purchased from Flynn & O'Hara\*\***
- School sweatshirts or navy blue fleeces may also be worn in place of the school sweater. The fleece is available from Flynn & O'Hara.

**\*\*Khaki uniform shorts** may be worn during the months of **September, October, April, May and June**. Shorts may be purchased through Flynn & O'Hara, Target, or JCPenney. Bermuda style shorts only should be worn. **Cargo shorts are NOT permitted.\*\***

### USED UNIFORMS:

We have a good selection of used uniforms in a variety of sizes available outside of the girl's bathroom in the cafeteria. These are free to anyone who can use them. If anyone has used uniforms that they no longer need, please donate them to our collection. Many families take advantage of this wonderful service.
