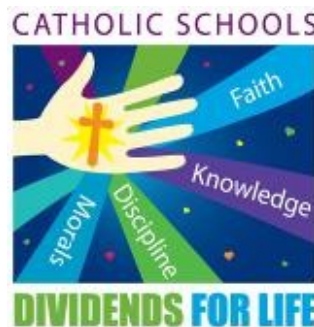

3. When your child will need to be released early from school, please send in with them a written explanation of the nature of the appointment to the classroom teacher. The teacher will forward this note to the office. Please

let the office know you are at the front door and we will send your child (ren) down to you.

Protecting God's Children Workshop

St. Joseph Regional School will be hosting a "Protecting God's Children" workshop on Tuesday, October 25th beginning at 6:00 PM. It is a Diocesan policy that anyone who works with children in any capacity must attend one of these workshops. If you plan to volunteer in your child's classroom, work in the

cafeteria, coach basketball, or even accompany your child's class on a field trip, **this workshop is mandatory.** Those who participated in the workshop previously need not attend again, however, you need to update your status by reading the monthly bulletins online. Pre-registration is

Parking Lot

Please do not drive up to the school building to leave children or pick them up during school hours. Please share this with anyone else that you may ask to drive your children to and from school so that everyone is aware of this policy.

Please do not park west of the annex building, as this area is part of the morning bus drop-off route. Park in the rows near Summit Street or in the Richmond Library parking lot. Thank you for helping to keep our children safe each day.



Morning Attendance

Each morning students should be in their homerooms by 8:00 a.m. Teachers in grades K-6 will officially take attendance at 8:10 a.m. **Any student not in their homeroom by 8:10 will be marked "tardy."** This must be followed by a signed written excuse by the parent as to the reason for being late. Late students must first report to the office.

School Safety Plan

St. Joseph Regional School's Safety Plan has been updated for the 2022-2023 school year. Copies of this plan are kept in the main office and are available for review.



Arrival and Dismissal



Students should arrive between 7:45-8:00 AM each day. Please note: The main entrance doors are not unlocked until 7:30 AM each day and there is no one to supervise your child(ren) until this time.

Please adhere to our dismissal procedure which will allow us to make this very hectic time of

the day as safe and efficient as possible:

1. Bus students are released as their buses arrive beginning at 2:20 p.m.
2. Students in grades K-6 who are being picked up are escorted by their teacher to the parking lot at approximately 2:35 p.m.

Parents should not come to the classrooms to pick up children. Please wait for them in the parking lot.

3. For the safety of the children, please do not request walkers/riders be dismissed prior to 2:35 p.m. when buses are entering and leaving the parking lot.

Mass

Children in grades K-6 will attend the 9:00AM school Mass on Fridays. Families are welcome to join us.



SCRIPS Program

Our Scrips Program will continue again this year. According to NY State non-profit tax code, fundraising must benefit the organization and not an individual. This means Scrips sold may not reduce tuition for one student or family, but for the entire student population. Please realize that those who purchase Scrips cards will be benefitting the school which will equally reduce all students'

tuition.

Report Cards/Trimesters

St. Joseph Regional School follows the guidelines established by the Diocese of Buffalo. Grades K-2 use letter grades (A, B, C...) in all subject areas. A numerical grade is calculated in all subject areas for grades 3-6. The passing grade for students in these grades is 70%. Our school will be utilizing trimesters again this year, rather than quarters. Trimester averages are calculated using a weighted formula based on the number of days a student spends on a subject per week. First trimester interim reports will be distributed on October 21st. Report cards will be distributed on December 9th.

Envelope Policy



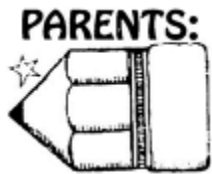
Monthly information will be sent home in a family envelope with the youngest child of each

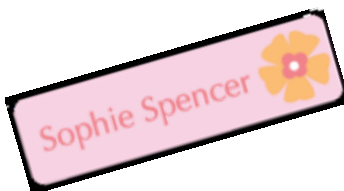
Asbestos Notification

After School Program

It's not too late to sign up for our After School Program being run by LE3 Inc. The program runs from dismissal until 6:00 PM each day that school is in session. This program is intended to be flexible, so that your child can participate on a daily or weekly basis. Registration forms and a handbook are available on www.le3inc-inc.org.



Uniform Lending Closet

The school uniforms lending closet is located outside of the girls' restroom in the cafeteria. We encourage you to check them out, most are in good shape and are free for the taking. If anyone has used uniforms to donate, please drop them off in the containers outside of the girls' bathroom. Thank you to Nurse Dawn for all the time and effort she gave organizing our lending closet this summer!

School Nurse

Nurse Dawn will be in the school Monday-Friday from 7:30 -2:30. Please review the school policy which incorporates the Health Laws of New York State that is found in the Handbook in regards to medication. Over-the-counter medicine is not allowed in school with the children unless they have a doctor's note.

PLEASE NOTE:

If your **child** is to receive **medication at school**, whether

it is **prescribed** by your physician **or is over-the-counter** medicine, a **form is required** to be filled out completely and **signed by your physician** before the medication may be dispensed at school. Forms are available at your doctor's office or in the nurse's office.

Security System

All doors to the school will be locked at all times. Any visitor must press the intercom button and stand back away from the door to be "buzzed in" once a staff member has verified identity via security cameras. Please be patient with us and realize that there may be times when you may have a brief wait for admittance if the office staff are on the phone or otherwise occupied.

Anyone entering the school building must check in at the school office on the second floor so we know at all times who is in the building. Thank you for your cooperation!

Gym Reminders

Please remind your child of the importance of proper footwear required for their physical education class. St. Joseph Regional School rules require sneakers to be worn in all PE classes. The sneaker requirement serves two purposes. Most importantly, sneakers protect the student's feet and legs during the wide variety of activities they

participate in. Secondly, sneakers with non-marking rubber soles also protect the gym floor from unnecessary damage. Sandals, slip-on shoes and sneakers with elevated heels and midsoles are not appropriate.

Please remind your child to bring their sneakers on scheduled gym days. Students in all grades are not being required to change into gym

clothes again this year, so please try and utilize the gym uniform through T-Shirts. Etc. We wouldn't want your child to miss out on all the fun!



Daily Home Screening for Students

If your child has any of the following symptoms, that indicates a possible illness that may decrease the student's ability to learn and also put them at risk for spreading illness to others, please keep them home. Check your child for these symptoms: each day:

- Temperature 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher when taken by mouth

- Sore throat
- **New** uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (for students with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their cough from baseline)
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain
- New onset of severe headache, especially with a fever

This system allows us to send email, text and voice messages.

Please note that not all messages are sent in all formats. That is, a time-sensitive message might be sent via text while a routine message might be sent via e-mail. For this reason we

encourage families to register all forms of contact with us. Once you have registered a cell phone number with us and that number is entered into our database you will "opt-in" or "subscribe" to begin receiving text messages by texting "subscribe" to 68453.
